Individual numbers may be up to six digits long and should not include alphabetic characters.
- 2. Replacement tags. Lost or worn registered tags should always be replaced, preferably with an identical tag or as required by statute. Any retag involving a number different to that originally recorded must be notified to the Registrations Secretary or the sheep will become de-registered.
